## Scam: Donations to Help Chinese Earthquake Victims Target: Undetermined

Beware of e-mails claiming to raise money to help victims of the recent earthquake in China. These e-mails solicit contributions and claim to be from a charitable organization; some claim to offer free vacation trips to the largest donors and use fake logos from legitimate online pay services.

## Follow these tips to help secure your personal and financial information:

- **Do not** respond, click on links, or open attached files from unsolicited (spam) e-mail. These files may contain viruses.
- Be skeptical of individuals representing themselves as officials soliciting donations via e-mail.
- Always make contributions directly to recognized organizations, rather than relying on others to make the donation on your behalf.
- Validate the legitimacy of the organization by directly accessing the recognized charity or aid organization's website, rather than following an alleged link to the site.
- **Do not provide** personal or financial information to anyone who solicits contributions. Providing such information may compromise your identity and expose you to identity theft.
